Community Assembly held in La Libertad

Saturday, June 8th. A total of 70 leaders of the hamlet Plan del Amate, Tacachico, La Libertad, participated in a community assembly, where they prioritized the issue: Paving of the access road to the hamlet.

Of the 70 leaders present at this assembly, 60 voted for this issue. Six voted for street lighting and four for the improvement of the community house.

Subsequently, the Research Committee was formed with 15 leaders.

The Plan del Amate hamlet is a community made up of 100 families, who have already managed to resolve one issue. Which was: Forging of the access road.



Community assembly held in Santa Ana

Thursday, June 13th. A total of 40 leaders participated in the community assembly, which was held in Lotificación Jerusalén, canton Planes de La Laguna, Santa Ana, where the issue was prioritized: Streets in poor condition.

This community is made up of 54 families. More than half of those attending the community assembly agreed to work to improve the community's streets. The lack of street lighting and the introduction of electric power to an area of the community were other needs expressed by the leaders.

Subsequently, the Research Committee was formed. The committee was made up of 25 leaders.

Sunday, June 9th. A total of 120 leaders gathered in a community assembly, which was held in Petaca, San Julian, Sonsonate. Where they prioritized the issue: Improvement of the drinking water system.

In second place is the repair of the main street and passages, and in third place is the construction of a community house.

Thursday, June 13, 2024. A total of 76 leaders of 11 communities belonging to the municipality of San Salvador Sur, requested a meeting with Mayor Mario Vasquez and his council to demand attention to projects in their communities.

The leaders made this request by means of a letter, which was delivered to the Mayor's Office of San Salvador Sur. The letter was received by the Mayor José Canales.

For his part, Canales explained that this request will be followed up. However, he mentioned that they are still in the 100-day transition stage.

Finally, the leaders said that they will wait for a response to their petition. If necessary, they will return to the municipality.

Paving of streets, lack of potable water, formation of gullies are some of the main needs faced by the leaders of: Brisas del Sur and Miramar in Santo Tomas, Las Neblinas in Panchimalco among others.

Cedros Abajo is composed of 44 families and 173 inhabitants. In this area, the leaders only had a small church, where a maximum of fifteen people could meet inside. The rest had to stay outside due to lack of space in the area.
